TOGETHER IN WORSHIP AND SUNDAY SCHOOL

Andrea Boone and her talented crew of "technicians" Miranda Moore, Darin Pearson and Doug Settles, do an outstanding job providing a quality online experience of Sunday worship. While on vacation, I enjoyed attending Second Presbyterian Church from the beach and from the mountains, hearing Ben and Elizabeth deliver good sermons. I remain grateful that we have this online capability not only for worship but also for some meetings and educational opportunities.

That said, now that we are past the mid-point of summer and moving toward Rally Day and a new program year, I would like to raise the unique value of being together, particularly in-person worship and Sunday school.

1. A sense of community.

Sunday school and worship experiences create a vital community. When we gather, personal connections deepen. We catch up on each other's lives and families. Joys, concerns and sorrows are shared. We develop friendships with people we would not ordinarily see, and we gain perspectives we would not otherwise have gained. As we learn together and are inspired together, we gain a sense of a

shared vision and common cause. We develop a stake, not only in each other's lives, but also in our shared life together.

2. Overcoming isolation and loneliness.

The fellowship of Sunday school and worship provide a powerful antidote to isolation and loneliness, both of which were intensified during the pandemic. By coming together with others who share beliefs and values, we find solace and a sense of belonging. Also, by addressing our attention on faith, we gain a greater awareness of God's presence in our lives. We grow to trust the truth of what we read in scripture that we are never alone but always in God's presence.

3. We are a needed body of Christ in our country and world.

Many cultural observers are pointing out that there is a great need in our world today for inter-generational communities of people with diverse views where devotion is shared and common ground discovered. As the country grows polarized, a healthy community of faith such as Second Presbyterian becomes itself a witness. We show the world that it is possible for people who think differently to care about each other, enjoy being with each other, and find common ground to offer remarkable ministries that positively affect people's lives and the well-being of the community.

4. Keeping baptismal vows really does bless lives.

At baptism, we promise to be faithful to each other and to nurture each other in the faith. For children, this can make all the difference in the world. Unlike school and activities that focus on performance, church becomes a place of unconditional acceptance. Children begin to assume that adults beyond their parents care for them and that they have a community interested in them and wanting them to be safe and to flourish. They learn they have a church home where they are always welcome. Children especially don't learn this by being told. They learn this by being present and experiencing it.

There are more reasons than this to make the effort to be present to each other in Christian community. I offer them with conviction because so much of what I believe, value and treasure has been gained by being a part of a Christian community of faith.

Again, I am grateful we have the opportunity for people to study and worship online. But I hope to see many of you in church... and often.





CHRISTIANITY AND CLIMATE CHANGE A FILM SERIES CLASS & CONVERSATION BEGINNING SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2023

Global heat mark set, then broken

Earth setting daily heat records this week as climate change ramps up

Rarely does a day go by that we don't read a headline related to climate change. What then are we to say about these things? Does Christianity have anything to say about climate change? Do you want to take a closer look at the climate crisis and how one Christian believes we are called to respond? Come and be a part of the conversation. The most important thing we can do is talk about it and how it effects all of us.

Christianity and Climate Change* is a nine-part film series featuring Katharine Hayhoe, the internationally renowned



Christian climate scientist. In each episode, she responds to climate questions from key church leaders and members from across Scotland. Following each video, we will ask the questions: What then are we to say about these things? And equally important, what then are we to think about these things and do about these things... to protect creation and help prepare for a changing climate?

Dr. Hayhoe captures the essence of the class in the following quote, "For Christians, doing something about climate change is about living out our faith...caring for those who need help and taking responsibility for this planet that God created and entrusted to us. My faith tells me that God does want people to understand climate change and do something about it."

Our own Presbytery of the Peaks states, "As a faith community, we can be a model to the larger community and a witness to the faith we profess by taking visible concrete actions that express what we believe about creation and our role in caring for it."

And from the General Assembly PCUSA, "We recognize and accept that restoring creation is a central concern of the church, to be incorporated into its life and mission at every level, with major implications for infusion into theological work, evangelism, education, justice and peacemaking, worship and liturgy, public witness, global mission and congregational service, and action at the community level."


