What would a birth announcement for Jesus sound like? Well, John's Gospel provides us with one: "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son."

What would a birth certificate for Jesus look like, if birth certificates were a thing in his day? What information would be printed on it? Would it look like this?

SEMINAR ON GRIEF AND HEALING / THE LONGEST NIGHT SERVICE Thursday, December 7 @ 5:30 p.m. **Register Online by December 4**

For those who have experienced loss, the holidays can be a particularly painful time, stirring up grief in acute ways. The Congregational Life Committee invites members of our church and community who have experienced the loss of a loved one to come together for a special seminar on the topic of grief and healing during the holidays. Dr. Paula Wolfteich, Ph.D., will lead a presentation and activity, focusing on grief and loss during this sometimes painful season. Dr. Wolfteich is a licensed clinical psychologist and is the director of Carilion's Center for Grief and Healing.



On Thursday, December 7, from 5:30-7:00 p.m. in the Session Room, participants will learn about coping with grief during the holidays, hear about Carilion's grief support groups, and spend time crafting a memorial ornament for their homes. Participants are welcome to bring small photos or mementos to include in their ornament, but this is not required.



SUSTAINABILITY SPOTLIGHT TAKING A CLOSER LOOK AT CLIMATE CHANGE: A VISION OF HOW CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED TO RESPOND

This fall, 10-15 individuals have been attending a Sunday school class called Christianity and Climate Change. See https://www.tearfund.org/campaigns/christianity-and-climate-change-film-series. The class is being hosted by Second's Green Team and is based on a nine-part film series produced in 2021 by Tearfund.¹ The film series features key church leaders and members in Scotland asking Dr. Katharine Hayhoe, internationally renowned Christian climate



scientist, how Christians are called to care for Creation and care for people in needespecially those most impacted by and least responsible for a changing climate. The film series comes with a leader's guide (https://urlzs.com/6yvkB) that provides discussion questions, action to take, and more from Katharine Hayhoe.

The class is also taking inspiration from Katharine Hayhoe's book, Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World. Published in 2022, the book closely parallels the film series and goes into much greater depth on many of the climate change issues. One of the many takeaways is Katharine Hayhoe's strong conviction that the most important thing we can do to bring people together and address climate change is: "Talk about it." The Green Team has gifted a copy of Katharine Hayhoe's book to the church library.

She has previously noted, "For Christians, doing something about climate change is about living out our faith...caring for those who need help and taking responsibility for this planet that God created and entrusted to us. My faith tells me that God does want people to understand climate change and do something about it."

In the book's preface she writes, "The bottom line is this. To care about climate change, you only need to be one thing, and that's a person living on planet Earth who wants a better future. Chances are, you're already that person—and so is everyone else you know."



Class participants meet in the Klein Classroom sitting at the large conference table formerly used by the Session. We begin with prayer, followed by an inspirational music video, followed by the film series, and close with conversation and discussion. While the film series portion of the class has ended, we are continuing to meet through Sunday, Dec 17 to talk about how God is calling us to care for Creation—and in what form members' concern and care for Creation might continue into the future. In the meantime, please enjoy viewing the film series and reading through the leader's guide using the links provided above.

The Designated Funds Oversight Committee (DFOC)

As Chairman of the Designated Funds Oversight Committee, I have been asked to provide an overview of this committee and our responsibilities to SPRES and the congregation. The DFOC was created in 2005 as a Subcommittee of the Finance Committee for the purpose of overseeing the various designated funds of Second Presbyterian Church. These funds include The Kitty Susan Trent Fund, The Edmunds Fund, The Mountain Avenue Fund, The Property Maintenance and Repair Fund, The W.R. Klein Fund, The Preschool Endowment Fund, The Trustee's Fund, The Columbarium Fund, The Organ Maintenance Fund, The Music Endowment Fund, and The Session Reserve Limited Fund.

These funds are exclusive of the Second Fund. Since 2005, the fund's assets have grown to over \$5,000,000.00. The Texas Presbyterian Foundation is DFOC's current investment advisor. The designated funds receive annual distributions through the DFOC's spending policy. \$1,386,447.00 has been paid to the above 11 Funds over the past 6 years.

The DFOC is tasked with the following responsibilities: Creation, Oversight, and Review of the Investment Policy Statement, and the fund's Spending Policies. Our committee meets with the Investment Advisor every six months and conducts a Request for Proposal Program periodically for the purpose of hiring an Investment Advisor to manage the fund's assets.

The fund's assets grow by contributions of present interest (cash, appreciated stock), bequests, memorials, and the interest earned from the fund's invested assets. We are grateful for the generosity of our member's financial support over the years.
