But a constant in the human story is that every life faces suffering. Paul's life was no different. And yet, on Paul's worst days, he still exhibited a spirit of joy. In this spirit of joy, Paul offers us some inspiration. Joy is not a common reality in modern life. We are more acquainted with anxiety and fear, and on good days we can settle for happiness; but joy is less common. The worst days come to all of us. At some point the dreams die, the body fails, the spirit is crushed. Those days leave their mark on us. But an imprisoned apostle passed down 104 verses to an ancient congregation in Philippi, and they have passed it down to us. It is their testimony that when the worst days come—and they will—they do not have to be the end of joy. Indeed, they might be the beginning.




BENCHMARKING SECOND'S CO2 EMISSIONS

One of the primary goals of the Green Team is benchmarking the church's annual CO_2 emissions. Why? Because, "You can't manage what you can't measure..." and decreasing the church's carbon emissions is what it's all about when it comes to maintaining a stable climate—a climate that supports the life-sustaining ecosystems we rely on for clean air, clean water, abundant food, and life on Earth as we know it. The graph below illustrates atmospheric CO_2 levels consistent over the past 800,000 years.

Beginning in the 1950's, levels of CO₂ began rising above 280 ppm to more than 420 ppm today. The last time CO₂ matched today's human-caused levels was 14 million years ago, according to a new study published in the journal *Science*.² As a greenhouse gas, CO₂ traps the Sun's heat in the Earth's atmosphere and oceans causing the planet to heat up. Such levels are unprecedented in human history.

As illustrated in the pie chart, the majority of church CO_2 emissions for 2019 resulted from the church's use of electricity. The Green Team and Property Committee are focusing on making the church more energy efficient, thereby reducing its electrical use. Last month's *Spotlight* featured replacing fluorescent lights with LED's, as one way this is being accomplished. In 2019, the church's emissions due to electricity use were equivalent to 477 tons of CO_2 . Calculating subsequent years' emissions will use 2019 as the benchmark. Look for more on this topic and the difference these efforts are making in future *Spotlights*.

We hope to plan a dedication service for this house in late July or August. Stay tuned for updates!


