

was the officiant. Paige told me it was just the wedding she wanted, which gladdened this daddy's heart. What is happening now is a three-day wedding/party. If I'm there now, I can promise you that I have little idea of what I am into. I'll come back with traditional Indian suits and stories to tell.

On Mother's Day, Sunday, May 12, four days after I return, the dedication of Alexa House will take place at 5:00 p.m. We will honor the lives of three people tragically lost to us, Alexa Cannon, Rita Magnus and Dan Yardley, as we celebrate the use of the house as a place of shelter, encouragement and hope for families working to build a better life.

A donation basket will be set out during the dedication service for the collection of \$25 Kroger gift cards for Family Promise. Family Promise provides these gift cards when needed to allow families to buy essentials such as food and gas.

Immediately following the service, a Groundbreaking Ceremony for the *The Rita Magnus Memorial Playground* behind Alexa House will take place, along with a reception in the church courtyard on 3rd Street with refreshments provided by the Roanoke Co+op. Alexa House has been decorated beautifully and will be open for public viewing the hour following the worship service.

While we hope you can join us in person for this celebratory occasion, the Service of Dedication will be made available via live stream.

SECOND REPLACES FLUORESCENTS WITH LEDs PEOPLE AT SECOND GET TOGETHER TO PROTECT OUR COMMON HOME

Filled with the spirit of Easter Morning (where the glory of God’s saving grace is revealed); the Solar Eclipse (where the glory of God’s universe is displayed); the Great Day of Service (where the glory of God’s Son is realized in serving others); and Earth Day (where the glory of God’s “*Good Green Earth*” is celebrated around the world), we get “*a glimpse into God’s Kingdom and learn that we are called to live into that Kingdom here and now.*”

So how does one segue from the sublime to the everyday? Simple...replace old lights with LEDs!

Responding to the call to live into God’s Kingdom here and now, the Property Committee and Green Team recently completed the replacement of 900 fluorescent tubes in the main church building with energy efficient light emitting diode (LED) tubes. Partnering with APCO’s Business Energy Solutions program, the church received a 30% rebate on the \$17,500 total project cost. The payback period is 3.5 years. Also, the church will use 20%-30% fewer kilowatt hours (kWh) annually—effectively reducing the church’s greenhouse gas emissions, helping to mitigate negative health effects, and saving money on the electric bill so church funds can be applied elsewhere.



Why do this? Because, in the words of Christian Climate Scientist Katharine Hayhoe, “*The planet is running a fever.*” 2023 was the hottest year on record since global temperature monitoring of the land and the ocean began. Similarly, the last 10 consecutive months have been the hottest recorded.¹ 2024 is on pace to be hotter than 2023!

Guest Speaker, Rev. Tom Are, Jr., Interim Pastor at Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago, IL. The world the apostle Paul inhabited was dramatically different from our time. He knew nothing of capitalism, or physics, or Zoom, and more significantly, Paul was a regular in Caesar’s prison. For us, “Caesar” is a salad. But a constant in the human story is that every life faces suffering. Paul’s life was no different. And yet, on Paul’s worst days, he still exhibited a spirit of joy. In this spirit of joy, Paul offers us some inspiration. Joy is not a common reality in modern life. We are more acquainted with anxiety and fear, and on good days we can settle for happiness; but joy is less common. The worst days come to all of us. At some point the dreams die, the body fails, the spirit is crushed. Those days leave their mark on us. But an imprisoned apostle passed down 104 verses to an ancient congregation in Philippi, and they have passed it down to us. It is their testimony that when the worst days come—and they will—they do not have to be the end of joy. Indeed, they might be the beginning.


