



<sup>1</sup> Why are the paraments green in the summer?: Green represents growth and is used during Ordinary Time (the season after Epiphany and the season after Pentecost).

<sup>3</sup> DAVID AND GOLIATH: The story of David slaying Goliath, violent though it is, has been used for generations to open the imagination of children to the Lord's power. At the heart of the story is the dramatic moment when young David "in the name of the Lord of hosts" defeats gigantic, menacing Goliath. It is a momentous encounter, and many learn it engaging their imagination and wonder as children. At the same time, this story is anything but child's play, especially when reduced to morals and values. Rather, this dramatic moment in David's story and in the story of Israel's monarchy is an integral part of the story of the Lord's defeat of evil on the earth.

<sup>4</sup>The Outreach Offering for the month of June will benefit *Children's Summer* Camps. The school year has ended, and several of our children's support ministries have expressed concern at the higher cost of providing summer activities for the children they serve. In response, the Service and Outreach Committee decided to commit the June Outreach Offering to the support of children's summer programs. Consequently, the June Outreach offering will be split four ways to help key area ministries provide wholesome summer activities for children. The four organizations are Presbyterian Community Center (for summer Pathways), the Salvation Army (for summer camps), West End Center (for swimming passes and activities) and Kids Soar (for their summer life skills program). These funds will allow more children to enjoy these summer experiences. As of June 13, \$1,700.50 has been collected.
