BULLETIN NOTES

¹ *O FOR A WORLD* is a new hymn set to a familiar, tune. The lyrics were written for the Presbyterian Women's Triennial Conference held at Purdue University in July, 1982. The hymn expresses a hope for a world that does not yet exist. The phrase, "O for a World," plays off the title and tune of a Charles Wesley hymn, "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing." Both hymns envision a world of reconciled nations and cultures where all are joined.

² The Outreach Offering for the month of July will benefit the *TAP Super Hero Kids* program. Money collected this month will help relocate the Super Hero Kids program into new facilities in Lincoln Terrace community center. This important program is a longstanding therapeutic healing arts program for children and adolescents (ages 5-17) experiencing and witnessing domestic abuse and other forms of family violence. The program is designed to feel like play but also works on emotional skills, coping skills and building resilience. The new space at Lincoln Terrace needs some renovating and furnishing which will cost approximately \$10,000. TAP has raised 50% of this cost, and proceeds from our July outreach offering will help fund the remainder of this cost. As of Thursday, July 25, \$3,360 has been collected.

The Outreach Offering for the month of June benefited *Children's Summer Camps*. In total, \$4,166 was collected.
