A Guide for Proportional Giving

Seek a level of giving that avoids the guilt of giving too little and the anxiety of giving too much. Find the level of giving that is a joyful expression of your faith. Find the level of giving that helps you know you are a generous person, not a greedy one, a giver and not a taker, the steward of your resources rather than its slave. Seek to grow in God's grace, and then reflect that growth in your stewardship.

BULLETIN NOTES

¹ On Commitment Sunday, individuals in the Second Presbyterian Church community make financial promises to the work and witness of the church in the coming year. In the Presbyterian tradition, the pledge (a financial promise) is a celebration of the privilege of the commitment of our lives in a response of gratitude for God's grace. Pledges are placed in a "Blessing Box" on which is inscribed a symbol portraying God's grace and our response. During the last hymn and Procession of Joyful Stewards, the Blessing Box is carried to the front of the church. Those members and supporters of the work and witness of the church who are prepared to make their financial pledge then follow to place that pledge in the box as an act of joyful commitment. The individuals who carry the box forward are trustees of the church, symbolizing the responsibility of the church in being good stewards of those funds in support of the ministry of Christ's church. The trustees of Second Presbyterian are Ron Ayers, Mary Ann Johnson, and Al McLean.

² The Outreach Offering for the month of October will go to *Restoration Housing* to help replace the porch on the Patterson Avenue project. The house will be a treatment facility for pregnant and postpartum women with substance use disorder and their infants. The project is part of a partnership involving Carilion Clinic, Anderson Treatment, and the Twelve Foundation. Once this rehab work is complete in early 2025, the Grove on Patterson will serve up to 16 women and 16 infants at any given time and will be a critical resource for families in Roanoke. After rehab work began in early August of this year, Restoration Housing's contractor uncovered significant deterioration of the front porch roof that was not originally evident when the project was first budgeted. There is now a budget shortfall of \$15,000 to cover the expenses to replace this roof, which wraps around three quarters of the perimeter of the first floor of the house. Any contributions made will go directly toward this budget shortfall to help replace the historic front porch roof. As of Tuesday, October 8, \$410.00 has been collected.
