BULLETIN NOTES

¹ Preschool Sunday: Second Presbyterian Church's preschool has been an important part of the church's ministry since 1953. The philosophy being the preschool has evolved over the years. Our programs are grounded in a developmental approach to learning. Our classrooms and activities reflect that approach. We incorporate lots of play time to provide children the time and space they need to grow. We place emphasis on the joy of learning. This philosophy provides each child with the opportunity to reach their God-given potential through thoughtful instruction.

³ THE OUTREACH OFFERING for the month of October will go to *Restoration* Housing to help replace the porch on the Patterson Avenue project. The house will be a treatment facility for pregnant and postpartum women with substance use disorder and their infants. The project is part of a partnership involving Carilion Clinic, Anderson Treatment, and the Twelve Foundation. Once this rehab work is complete in early 2025, the Grove on Patterson will serve up to 16 women and 16 infants at any given time and will be a critical resource for families in Roanoke. After rehab work began in early August of this year, Restoration Housing's contractor uncovered significant deterioration of the front porch roof that was not originally evident when the project was first budgeted. There is now a budget shortfall of \$15,000 to cover the expenses to replace this roof, which wraps around three quarters of the perimeter of the first floor of the house. Any contributions made will go directly toward this budget shortfall to help replace the historic front porch roof. As of Thursday, October 17, \$1,437.00 has been collected.
