



**BULLETIN NOTES** 

<sup>1</sup> **Notes About Today's Scripture:** The book of Job comes from the Wisdom Literature of the Bible. The book begins with a prose prologue, moves into poetry, and then ends with a prose epilogue. The beginning and end probably come from a story adapted for the sake of the poetry which expresses lament, coveys debate, and offers perspective on the will of God in the face of unfathomable tragedy. Within the poetry are three cycles of dialogue between Job and his friends, as well as a dialogue Job has with God. Wisdom that comes in the form of theological formulas and explanations is challenged.

<sup>2</sup>The Outreach Offering for the month of October will go to *Restoration Housing* to help replace the porch on the Patterson Avenue project. The house will be a treatment facility for pregnant and postpartum women with substance use disorder and their infants. The project is part of a partnership involving Carilion Clinic, Anderson Treatment, and the Twelve Foundation. Once this rehab work is complete in early 2025, the Grove on Patterson will serve up to 16 women and 16 infants at any given time and will be a critical resource for families in Roanoke. After rehab work began in early August of this year, Restoration Housing's contractor uncovered significant deterioration of the front porch roof that was not originally evident when the project was first budgeted. There is now a budget shortfall of \$15,000 to cover the expenses to replace this roof, which wraps around three quarters of the perimeter of the first floor of the house. Any contributions made will go directly toward this budget shortfall to help replace the historic front porch roof. As of Tuesday, October 22, \$2,950.00 has been collected.
