We are encouraged to begin the season by examining why God's saving love is needed in our lives and in the world, and then anticipate God's saving work among us.

- ⁴ O Come, All YE FAITHFUL: John Francis Wade was among a hoard of Roman Catholics who fled to France from England after the Jacobite rebellion. Needing a way to support himself as a refugee, he taught music and became a copyist of musical scores. His work was exquisite. One hymn he copied was Adeste Fidelist Trimphantes. The assumption was someone else had composed it. However, research has determined with near certainty that he was the author. Wade died in France. When refugees were allowed to return to England, they brought Wade's manuscripts with them. Rev. Frederick Oakeley was impressed by Adeste Fidelis and translated it into English. "Ye Faithful, Approach Ye," did not catch on. He tried another translation, and "O Come, All Ye Faithful" became an Advent classic.
- ⁵ The Outreach Offering for December will support *Bradley Free Clinic*.
