The Roanoke Valley Children's Choir



Celebrating 38 years of excellence under the direction of Kimberly Ruse Davidson, the Roanoke Valley Children's Choir is a highly respected local arts organization with recent solo honor performances at Carnegie Hall, the National Cathedral, Canterbury Cathedral and American Choral Director Association divisional and national conventions. We teach school age singers how to work together and pursue excellence – in singing, in music, and in everyday life.

The RVCC choir program includes four choirs. An Early Elementary Choir for grades 1–2, an Upper Elementary Choir for grades 3–5, a Youth Choir for grades 5–9, and an advanced Concert Choir for grades 8–12. Rehearsals are held on Mondays from late August through April at Bethel Baptist Church in Salem.

All RVCC choristers perform in the annual RVCC Holiday and Spring Concerts, and enjoy the Fall Retreat weekend at Smith Mountain Lake 4–H Center every October. The Elementary and Middle School choirs also perform for local schools and attend the Music in the Parks festival in Williamsburg each Spring.

The High School Choir, singing for you today, performs annually with the Roanoke Symphony Orchestra at Holiday Pops and other RSO performances. Additionally, the High School Concert Choir performs at community events, and travels for honor and festival performances each year. This summer, the Concert Choir will be traveling to England to participate in the International Children's Choir Festival in London, Canterbury and Rochester, where we have been selected to sing as the solo Liturgical Choir.

We always love welcoming new singers into the choir! Introductory newcomer classes are held in May, August, and January each year. No audition is required to join the Elementary or Youth Choir Programs. High School singers audition with Ms. Davidson to join the advanced Concert Choir. The next newcomer classes for all ages of singers (1st-12th grade) will be on May 16th and 20th, 2025.

Along with our full choir program, the RVCC offers a beginner "Little Singers" Choir. This is a 6-week class each semester for children ages 4-6 to participate along with a parent, grandparent, or caregiver. Each semester has a new theme as we learn the beginnings of good choral technique, basic musicianship, and mostly have fun! The next Little Singers class will begin on March 10th, 2025 from 4:00-4:30 PM where we will have fun singing songs about animals and imagination!
