BULLETIN NOTES

¹ Christians meet for worship on the first day of the week, the day Christ Jesus rose from the dead. We gather to praise the triune God, confess our sin, and seek God's grace. We hear the good news of the gospel and celebrate the sacraments. We go forth to glorify God through the service of daily living.

³ When Presbyterians pray the Lord's Prayer we tend to use the words debts ("forgive us our debts") and debtors. Other Christian bodies use trespasses or sins. This is because the Lord's Prayer is found in both Matthew's and Luke's Gospels, and in the original Greek they used two different words that mean "to sin." In Matthew's version, the word used means "to owe a debt," but a debt of sin, not money. "Debt" implies an obligation to God, rather than a simple transgression.

⁴THE OUTREACH OFFERING for February will support two projects for children: Blessing Bags—age appropriate bags made by church member Cole Hoff for children of Family Promise guests at Alexa House—and Turn the Page, a Roanoke-based 501(c)3 non-profit organization dedicated to the mission of providing every child in the Roanoke Valley with a personal library in an effort to improve literacy and promote awareness to parents and caregivers of the benefits of reading at home. Founded in 2014, Turn the Page provides new hand-selected, age-appropriate books to local children, including newborns at Roanoke Carilion Hospital, at pediatric offices, and at several local elementary schools through their Books and Breakfast program in partnership with Roanoke City Public Schools.
